- **NEW:** PROJECT FREEDOM (Day 66): US military begins escorting stranded neutral-flag vessels out of Hormuz. Force package: 15,000 service members, 100+ land and sea-based aircraft, guided-missile destroyers, multi-domain unmanned platforms. Trump: "Countries from all over the world asked us to help free their ships. Any interference will be dealt with forcefully." Operation framed as humanitarian; Iran reviewing its response.
- **UPDATE:** IRAN 14-POINT PROPOSAL: Tehran submitted counter-proposal through Pakistan calling for permanent ceasefire within 30 days, mutual non-aggression pledge, gradual Hormuz reopening, phased lifting of US blockade. Trump rejected Saturday: "can't imagine it would be acceptable — they have not yet paid a big enough price." Iran reviewing US response. Parliament passing law to restrict Hormuz access to authorised vessels only.
- **UPDATE:** SANCTIONS RISK: US Treasury advisory: any company paying Iran a toll to transit Hormuz faces sanctions. Move One confirms zero exposure — all routing via Cape of Good Hope alternatives. No Move One cargo has transited Hormuz since Day 1. Also: US fast-tracked USD 8B+ in arms sales to Israel, Qatar, UAE and Kuwait (air-defence systems, laser-guided rockets).
- **UNCHANGED:** KUWAIT KWI EXPANDED: Jazeera Airways resumed full operations from T5 on 3 May — 27 destinations, 06:00–18:00. Kuwait Airways T4 operating since 26 April. T1 remains closed for repair. No foreign carrier (Emirates, Qatar Airways, British Airways, Turkish Airlines) has announced return date. Move One Kuwait coordinating all air cargo — advance booking required.



PROJECT FREEDOM LAUNCHES TODAY — US ESCORTS STRANDED SHIPS THROUGH HORMUZ — IRAN SANCTIONS THREAT — DAY 66

MOVE ONE ANALYSIS: PROJECT FREEDOM

What it actually is: US Navy ships will not directly escort commercial vessels but will be in the vicinity to deter Iranian attacks, providing ships with safe lane and mine-free route information. The first convoy of five supertankers completed passage without incident overnight.

What it is not: This is an exit operation for stranded neutral ships — not a full reopening of Hormuz. Trump stated ships "will not be returning until the area becomes safe for navigation." It gets trapped ships out but does not restore inbound commercial flows. Mines remain. War risk insurance remains withdrawn. Iran is still enforcing the strait.

Iran's reaction: Iran's parliament national security chief: "Any American interference in the new maritime regime of the Strait of Hormuz will be considered a violation of the ceasefire." Iran has not fired — yet. Move One assessment: Cape of Good Hope routing remains the only viable commercial option. Do not reposition cargo for Hormuz transit based on Project Freedom alone.
